

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- 1977-2006 **Senior Partner at Winston & Strawn, Washington, D.C.** Practiced as Senior Partner at Winston & Strawn, one of the oldest top 50 U.S. law firms. At age 34, appointed Partner-in-Charge of the Washington office and served in that capacity for many years representing banks and multi-national corporations in a broad range of transactions with an emphasis in Europe.
